



THE TASK FORCE TO DEMONSTRATE at TRUDEAU CABINET MEETING IN MONTREAL

The Task Force on Linguistic Policy supporters will rally in front of the Queen Elizabeth Hotel on Tuesday, January 23 from 12-2pm to express the grave disappointment of the English-speaking Quebecers with the Trudeau government.

"Our community of 1.25 million people has been completely abandoned, especially since the Trudeau government passed Bill C-13, the changes to the Official Languages Act, which incorporated the Charter of the French Language," said Task Force president Andrew Caddell. "We have always looked to the federal government to uphold our constitutional rights to English in services, education and the courts. However the Trudeau government has let us down, and continues to ignore our concerns, clearly valuing the votes of nationalists over those of Anglophone Quebecers."

The Task Force is currently before the courts with two cases against the Attorney-Generals of Quebec AND Canada, with an injunction against Bill 96 and a case filed in May of 2023 detailing the negative impacts of the law. An application for an interlocutory injunction against Bill 96 was filed in Superior Court last week and will be heard in February. The case filed in 2023 will be heard this fall.
